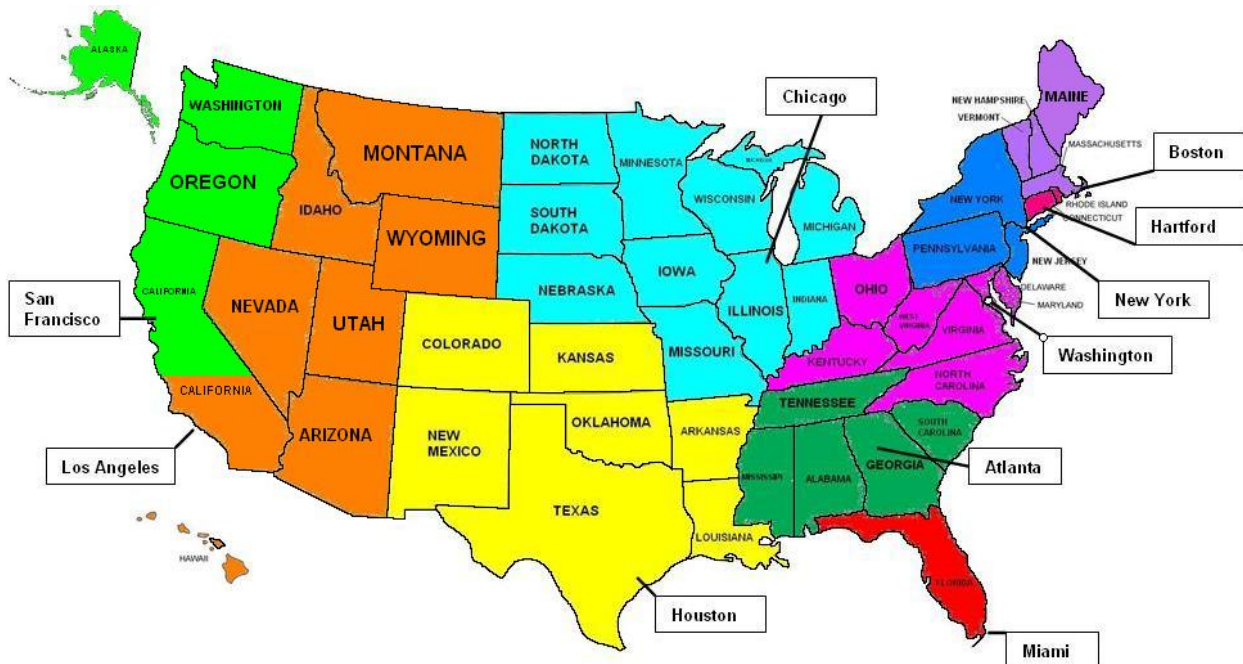
NOTE #1: If purchasing tickets without a travel agent, make sure you give yourself at least 2 hours to clear Immigration and Customs before a connecting flight from Sao Paulo/Rio/Manaus to Brasilia.

NOTE #2: Upon 1st entry into a country (Brazil or USA), you must go through Immigration, pickup your bags at baggage claim and clear Customs. Allow at least 1.5 hours for this process.

NOTE #3: If not traveling to/from Brasilia airport with the group, then you pay your taxi fare.

TOURIST VISA

Travel to Brazil from the United States requires a tourism visa. **The tourism visa is valid for 10 years.** Locate your Consulate on the map for your state of residence and get the contact info and address by visiting: <http://cgwashington.itamaraty.gov.br/en-us/jurisdictions.xml>

MEDICAL INSURANCE

The Casa requires all participants to supply proof of travel, health, hospitalization and hospital transportation insurance for this journey. I therefore need you to provide me with your medical insurance policy number and a phone contact to verify that your plan offers coverage in Brazil.

If your company does not provide coverage, I recommend these:

Both have individual or family plans and their insurance packages cover emergency medical and dental expenses, emergency medical evacuation/repatriation, flight delays and cancellations, trip interruption, baggage loss, and baggage delay for a very reasonable fee.

IMPORTANT: Once you have purchased your airline tickets you have **2 weeks** from date of ticket purchase to contact Travel Guard and buy insurance. This will ensure you are covered for all pre-existing medical conditions and that you will receive full coverage.

CARLTON HOTEL IN BRASILIA

The group spends Sunday night in Carlton Hotel. The official group trip begins Monday morning after check-out. Kathy will reserve single standard rooms for each participant unless they specify they want a double room to share with someone. Everyone should rest and relax after travel. Participants pay for the hotel bill with debit or credit card.

If checking-in before noon on Sunday, the hotel will charge an extra half-day room rate. The breakfast buffet is from 6am – 10am every day so if you arrive early on Sunday, be sure to go to the buffet and enjoy yourself before resting. Breakfast on Monday is included in room rate. The hotel in Abadiânia has free Wi-Fi accessibility. Only bed linens and towels are provided so pack your toiletries and items listed in the CLOTHING section.

There are internet cafes to pay for access (*beware of computer viruses if you use a USB drive*). You may call home at Fruitti's restaurant for reasonable rates.

CLOTHING

Casa days are Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. The Entities of the Casa request that you wear white clothing (top and bottom) for these sessions. Bring a minimum of two sets of white attire. You can have your clothes laundered. The temperature in Abadiânia is consistent, averaging 70-85F degrees during the day. It may be cooler at night and early mornings. A light jacket or sweater is recommended. May to October is generally dry and no rain gear is required but the sun is hot. Bring clothes for layering. Basic packing list includes the following:

- **All prescription medication and plenty to last at least 2 weeks (in your carry-on)**
- Electrical adapter-220v (for use with hairdryer, laptop, iPad)
- 1 pair casual walking/hiking shoes or sneakers, sandals
- 1-2 pair of shorts
- 1-2 pair of light slacks or skirts
- 2-4 short sleeve shirts, blouses or t-shirts
- 2 long sleeved shirts or blouses
- 1 sweater, sweatshirt or hoodie
- Socks, underwear, sleepwear
- Rain or windbreaker
- Good sunglasses
- Sun screen, chapstick with sun block, a brim hat for the sun
- Umbrella (for rain or sun protection regardless of season)
- Flashlight
- Alarm clock or cell phone you use to set an alarm
- Insect repellent (especially during wet season: November-April)
- Personal first aid supplies and/or feminine products
- Soap, shampoo, standard toiletries and personal items
- Inflatable cushion for sitting in current and on hard surfaces
- Swimsuit and towel for visit to the Sacred Waterfall
- White clothing for formal Casa Days
- Flip-flop or warm weather sandals
- Shoes that can get wet in rainy season and dry easily like rubber sandals
- 1-2 quart zip lock bags – each can carry 3 small bottles of blessed water

Do NOT over pack! Realize that during your trip to the Casa, you will have spiritual intervention. This means that you should not carry or lift anything over 10 lbs.

Travel light: 1 medium suitcase and 1 carry-on is more than enough for 2-weeks. I suggest wheeled carry-on to avoid anything heavy over shoulder on return trip.

MONEY

The currency of Brazil is the Brazilian Reais, BR (to get a sense of the exchange rate visit <http://www.xe.com/ucc/>). It is difficult to suggest how much money one needs to exchange for this trip as everyone has a different sense of what is 'essential' and the exchange rate changes. That said, **\$300-\$400** is adequate sum to bring for **essentials not included** in the trip itinerary. This would be **in addition** to money for herbs, blessed water, crystal light therapy bed sessions, food outside our hotel, and gratuities.

Do not bring traveler's cheques! You can purchase items from the Casa gift shop using US dollars and credit or debit cards. Some stores take credit cards. There is an ATM machine in our hotel front lobby but it charges a high fee.

Kathy will show the group where to exchange US Dollars for Brazilian Reais in Abadiania to get the best rate, so only exchange \$50 at airport initially.

URGENT: The week before departure put travel notifications for Brazil with any credit or debit cards you intend to use on the trip.

HEALTH

Vaccines are normally NOT REQUIRED for a trip to Abadiania. Please consult your physician about recommended vaccinations and medications. The Center for Disease Control can be contacted at (800) 232-4636 or www.cdc.gov. Their recommendation for a yellow fever vaccine changes according to conditions in the State of Goias. Also, if you are traveling through Manaus **it may be necessary to show proof of yellow fever vaccination or a doctor's note.** It is important that you discuss this with your own physician as a yellow fever shot is not advised for those suffering from immune issues or sensitivities. A hepatitis A vaccine is also sometimes advised but not required.

It is not recommended to drink or use water from the tap to brush your teeth if you are extremely sensitive to water changes. You can purchase bottled water, to brush your teeth or simply use blessed water purchased at the Casa. Remember that for your stay in Abadiânia drinking blessed water (blessed by the Entities) is part of the Casa healing protocol.

You may want to take a 12 pack of small bottled water home with you or a few bottles in your checked luggage. You can put 3 small bottles in a gallon zip lock bag. I will instruct you as to how to use the water once you return home. Be sure to bring a roll of duct tape if you want to take a case home. If taking home a case, you will pack these bottles in a small box to ensure bottles do not break in airplane. This box will be your 2nd piece of free checked luggage and you will be plastic wrap it at the Brasilia airport. I will provide you with full details on this a few days prior to your departure.

CASA PROTOCOLS

Please know you will return from the Casa refreshed and rejuvenated by the love and healing energy that embraces you there. As with Western medicine, not everyone who visits João de Deus is guaranteed a speedy, or one-time, physical cure. Spiritual work takes time so assume you should return and continue your spiritual work when possible.

Everyone receives a spiritual healing. Some see physical changes during the trip and some take time as the healing unfolds over months. The Casa Entities support you in your healing but they cannot override your free will to accept the energy. You must do your part in your healing. Be mindful that healing will occur at its own pace. Be gentle with yourself and have patience.

At the Casa you will be expected to observe certain dietary and life restrictions. The Casa is a spiritual hospital so you are asked to **refrain from** strenuous activity, hiking, jogging, and other rigorous activities. You are asked to go inward and slow down, spending as much time as possible in reflective solitude or meditation, not only during Casa days but throughout the entire trip. This is especially important if you receive intervention. Rest and recuperation is vital. Realize you will be a patient.

In addition, those who receive **intervention are required to abstain from all sexual activity for a period of 40 days.** This rule holds true for the **1st intervention only.** **For subsequent interventions you are to abstain from sexual activity until after the spiritual stitches are removed a week later.** Sexual activity means any rise of sexual energies.

You also cannot receive other spiritual healing/energy work for 40 days after each intervention. The only healing work that is permitted in this 40 days is the crystal bed.

If the Entities prescribe Casa herbs, you will need to forego alcoholic beverages, fertilized eggs, and chili peppers including black/white/cayenne pepper spices and hot sauces for the duration of the treatment, which is until you finish all the herbs. *Unless you get eggs directly from a farm where it's possible to have an embryo in the egg, all eggs in local stores are already non-fertilized eggs to pass inspection.* Remember that these dietary restrictions also hold for individuals whose photographs you present to the Entity for healing and they receive a prescription. If they are prescribed herbs, they must adhere to the dietary protocol once they receive the herbs. And remember, you must obtain permission from individuals who ask for healing. No dietary restrictions apply for those who seek a blessing.

Rest assured that I will review all Casa procedures and guidelines with you while in Abadiânia, so that you are fully informed and at ease with this process. We will also attend an English Casa Orientation on Tuesday 5pm as a group.
